




Seminar on Financial Literacy

Miss Charmaine Masangkay - STCQC Batch 2012





I first encountered STC on the day of my entrance exam. I vividly remember the wooden door swinging open in the Parlor Room as my mom spoke with an adult inside. I ran through the hallway of the clinic area to the guidance room, unaware that this moment would change my life forever—serving as my ticket to becoming a Theresian.

My mom always reminded me to study hard, explaining that being able to attend a school like STC was a gift—a privilege. At the time, as an innocent little girl, I didn't fully grasp her words. As I grew up in the halls of STC, I began to realize I was different from many of my classmates. Unlike them, I didn't have new, big stroller bags, Disney lunch boxes, glittery ribbons, or shiny shoes. I carried a hand—me—down bag and wore an old uniform; my books even had big labels reading "COMPLIMENTARY COPY NOT FOR SALE," which embarrassed me when I took them out in class. Nevertheless, life went on.

As I got older, I became increasingly aware of what I lacked. I remember being called into the SEFI Office for interviews and check-ins, where questions about my home life were asked. I didn't realize at the time how crucial this was for maintaining my scholarship. My parents were going through a difficult phase and were on the verge of separation. Gradually, I understood that I was part of a program designed to assist students financially so they could receive a quality education. This meant I had to maintain good grades and volunteer during the summer at the SEFI Booth to support the SAPAK Program for students like me. I eventually accepted that I might never be like my classmates, but I chose to use what I perceived as shortcomings as my greatest strengths. Without these challenges, I wouldn't be standing here today.

Looking back, I may not have had every privilege, but I consider my experiences at STC to be life-changing gifts. I will always be grateful for taking that entrance exam and navigating the hurdles I faced. I wouldn't change a thing because those challenges shaped who I am today. I learned to take care of myself and make the most of what I had, thanks to my not-so-pleasant experiences growing up. I am forever grateful to STC for teaching me to love with a heart as big as Christ's so that there would always be room for others.

I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to the Board of Trustees of SEFI, the generous sponsors and donors, and the administrators of both departments. Thank you so much. Without your support, I wouldn't be where I am today or who I am today. I hope and pray that God grants you the grace and desires of your heart to help future Theresians access the exceptional education they deserve. You are the shining stars that inspired us to dream and work hard for the futures we once thought unattainable. May you continue to extend your helping hand to my fellow Theresians, the future generation, and the hope for a brighter tomorrow. As the saying goes, "God puts people in our lives for a reason." Angeline Aquino Abanto - STCQC Batch 2003

I come from a large family with six sisters and a brother. All of my sisters graduated from St. Theresa's College and benefited from the SEFI program. My father worked abroad as an overseas Filipino worker (OFW), specifically as a construction worker in Japan, while our mother stayed home to care for us. Given our situation, it was almost impossible for all of us to attend a private school. However, my mom always said, "Your education is the only inheritance we can give you." She wanted us to have the best education possible, which is why we were enrolled at St. Theresa's College.

In 2002, my father suffered a stroke, followed by another in 2004 and a final one in 2006 before he passed away at the age of 46. At that time, my youngest sibling was only 7 years old and in grade 2. We faced immense emotional, mental, and financial struggles. We could barely afford rent and utilities while we were still in school. Some relatives and friends suggested that we transfer to a more affordable school to finish our education, but my mother remained determined.

In 2015, we celebrated my youngest sibling's high school graduation. We made it! All six of us graduated from St. Theresa's College of Quezon City, and SEFI made this possible.

Today, our lives are much different from what they were years ago, and we owe it all to SEFI. Thank you for supporting us all these years. We wouldn't be where we are today without you. We can't express our gratitude enough. Poverty can indeed hinder access to quality education, but with the help of dedicated individuals like you, we can overcome this obstacle and create opportunities for every child to receive the education she deserves. Please continue your advocacy and mission; you are making a greater impact than you may realize. You will always be a part of our lives.
